

Cloud Beach Shoreline Management

The Cloud family is working with Arundel Rivers Federation regarding an available grant to protect their shoreline (behind Cloud Field) through the addition of rock jetties. The companies working on this are: Restoration Systems (Project sponsor); Ecosystem Planning & Restoration (Design/Engineering); Resource Restoration Group (Construction); and Arundel Rivers Federation (Community Outreach and Permitting). The project is still in the review process and permits are currently being acquired. If approved,

the project should start late summer 2020 and should take about six weeks to complete. This project will involve trucking the stone in by road and down the community owned land that was formerly Mayo Road. (The TPPOA owns a 30ft wide strip of road connecting the culde-sac to the beach.) The TPPOA will communicate information as this project evolves by Facebook, email, and newsletter. The engineers will be invited to the next general meeting on April 1st to answer questions and provide updates to the community.

AEDs on the Island

AED stands for Automatic External Defibrillator. It is a device that delivers an electric shock through the chest wall to the heart. This is particularly important to anyone who experiences cardiac arrest, where time is critical. With CPR, AEDs increase a person's chance at survival. You DO NOT need to be specially trained to use them, just follow the device's audible and/or visual guide. Built in computers assess the victim's heart rhythm and rate, then judges whether a discharge or shock is necessary, and then administers it. Adult and pediatric sized electrodes and accessories are included. If you need help, always call 911 first.

On TPI we have two AED devices readily available. They are in protective boxes at 1169 Brice and at 3704 Ramsey. I recommend islanders take a moment to locate these boxes during an island walk, however, unless it's an emergency, please do not open the kit without notifying me. I also recommend watching a video demonstrating AED use at www.webMD.com/heart/video/how-to-use-aed. If anyone in the community wishes, I can arrange for a teaching demo and CPR instruction as well. If you do use the AED, please notify me for follow-up. Thanks!
