Halloween on Turkey Point






Turkey Point Autumn Art Competition



Baby Oysters are Back on our Community Pier!



water. Each cage has multiple oyster shells and each oyster shell has many baby oysters (spat) attached. The idea is to protect the spat from predators while they grow big enough to be on their own (crabs and rockfish eat them like potato chips!). In the spring, they will be taken to the sanctuary reef in

Glebe Bay and "planted" with the millions of other oysters there. Did you know a mature oyster filters 30 to 50 gallons of water each day and their reef provides habitat for other aquatic life? Sadly, the number of oysters in the Bay and its tributaries is less than 1% of historic levels.

TPPOA and island waterfront homeowners work with Arundel Rivers Federation to get cages and spat for this program. The only maintenance required is to lift the cages up out of the water and drop them back in a few times about once a week to keep barnacles and silt from smothering the spat. Feel free to do this when you are on the pier. Or lift them up, place them on the pier and admire all the critters these mini habitats support! The only precaution is that while the spat can survive in freezing water, they will die instantly when exposed to freezing air. So if it's freezing or below, don't lift them out of the water!
