

Cloud Beach Restoration

Cloud Beach is the beach on the Chesapeake Bay at the end of the Turkey Point Road. The TPPOA owns a 35-foot-wide path leading to this beach. The beach on either side of the TPPOA path is commonly referred to as Cloud Beach because the Clouds own it.

Cloud beach has eroded badly over the years. The Clouds are in the process of securing a grant through which it is hoped that some of the lost beach is restored. No final design for the restoration has been created and no contracts have been signed. Everything is in a development stage.

The purpose of this article is to make all islanders aware that if the grant goes through and contracts are signed the TPPOA path will more than likely be used to get material and equipment to Cloud Beach. The TPPOA Board has met with all parties and has been in on the process from the initial stages. It now is at the stage where it appears to be more likely than not that the Clouds will agree to have the work done.

No work will start this year and likely no work will begin until late summer of 2020.

If the work is to be done at some point, the TPPOA would have to sign a contract agreeing that the work can go forward. By signing the contract, the TPPOA will allow the community path to be used during construction. This will mean that no one can use the path for the approximate two months it is expected the work will take. TPPOA will also be signing a contract allowing the County to use the path once or twice annually to monitor the restoration and to make sure nothing is erected or done to affect the restoration.

The TPPOA will hold a meeting or meetings as needed for all Islanders to attend to discuss the design and anything else anyone wants to discuss regarding this restoration project prior to signing any contract.
